The provincial government has announced that West Lincoln Memorial Hospital is being rebuilt to keep hospital services in West Niagara for many years to come.

Everyone agrees that until this happens we have to keep the hospital we have today safe for everyone. Safety is not an option. This means renovating old areas of the hospital so they meet standards for infection control and other issues.
